

GETTING AROUND

There are a variety of ways to get to and from the event throughout the night.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT



PTV is helping customers get to and from White Night by running trains, trams, and Night Buses all night. City Loop train stations will be open all night. Please ensure you travel with a valid myki. Dedicated transport hubs will be located around the city where you can access tram, bus and taxi services. These hubs are clearly marked on the map.
